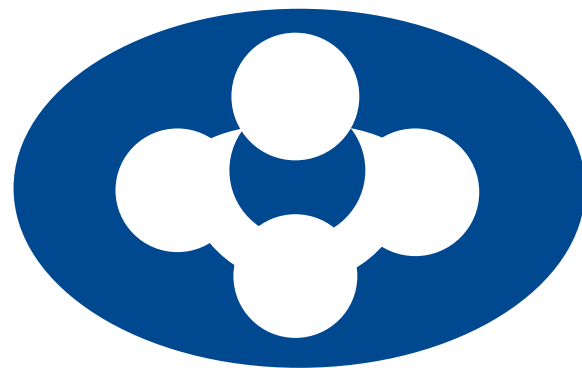

SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS ASPECTS IN MANAGEMENT

Scope

The incidence of Sexually Transmitted Infections(STIs) is underestimated. Many do not cause any signs or symptoms in the initial stages, and only present years later with serious complications, that may or may not be treatable. Chlamydia for instance is the number one cause of preventable and treatable tubal infertility. The Human Papilloma Virus is the cause of cervical carcinoma. The proper diagnosis and management of these infections is therefore crucial.

TREATMENT OF DEPRESSION IN THE ANTENATAL AND POST-NATAL PERIOD

Scope

Contrary to popular belief antenatal depression is common, affecting about 10%-12% of pregnant women. Antenatal depression is a risk factor for post-natal depression and up to 50% of women who are depressed during pregnancy become depressed post-natally. Post-natal depression affects up to 15% of women in the six months following childbirth.
